LOCAL CONNECTION



In Clayton County, a significant number of young men are in desperate need of housing to get their lives back on track. Many of the men are homeless, aging out of the foster care system or being released from incarceration.

United Way saw a community need and collaborated with the Clayton County Juvenile Court System to create a program to help improve the outlook for young men living with few assurances — Hearts To Nourish Hope. The program provides education, mentoring and career development for at-risk youth. In 2011, Hearts To Nourish Hope created a program called DORM (Development of Responsible Men), which provides housing for men ages 18 to 24.

As a result of the collaboration, a significant number of the young men in Clayton County are employed and are pursuing their GEDs. Last year alone, United Way helped more than 2,000 at-risk youth stay on track through after-school programs and career training.

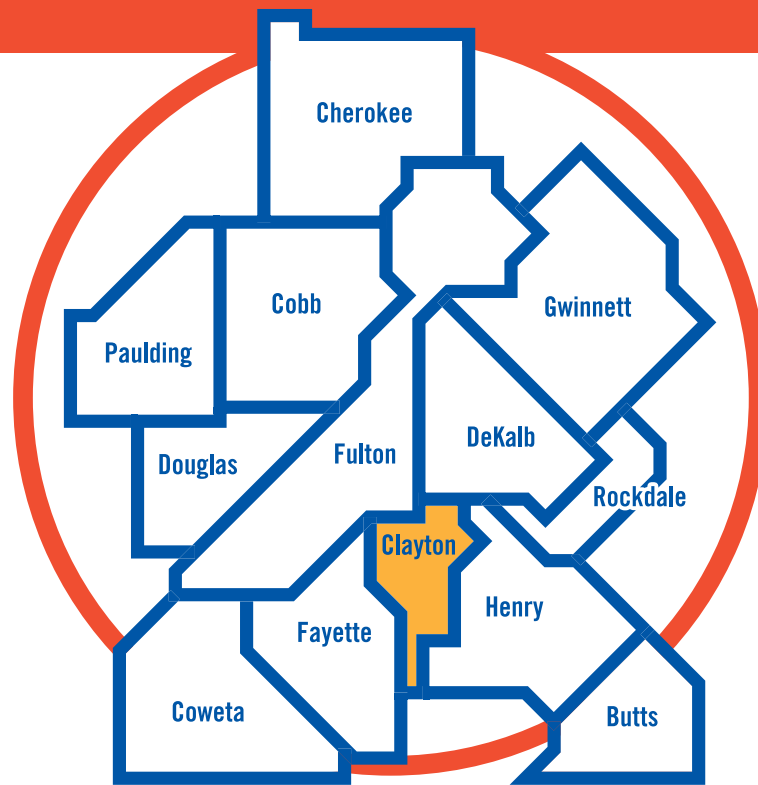

COMMUNITY HIGHLIGHTS

- Last year, United Way and its partners helped 13,359 individuals from Clayton County.
- 4,061 children showed academic improvement.
- 1,849 youth -made the decision to avoid risky behaviors after receiving skills training through targeted programs, including after-school programs
- 797 households received free tax preparation services
- 1,041 individuals received emergency financial assistance that enabled them to avoid homelessness and remain in safe and stable housing.
- 300 individuals now have a medical home (a routine place to receive preventative health care).
- During the summer of 2015, United Way's Silence the Growl campaign which supports summer feeding programs for children provided 1,319 meals for children in Clayton County.

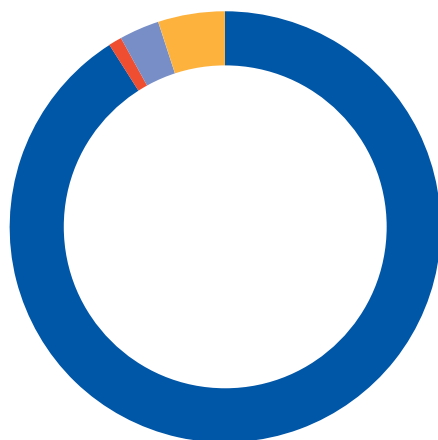


2-1-1 CLAYTON COUNTY

Information obtained from our 2-1-1 Contact Center is critical to maintaining a connection to the needs of each community United Way serves. 2-1-1 connects people 24/7 to the resources they need to address the everyday challenges of living, as well as those that develop during times of emergencies. Last year 2-1-1 received 14,684 contacts from Clayton County and the top 5 needs were **electrical service payment assistance (3,816)**, **food pantries (3,429)**, **rent payment assistance (2,716)**, **transitional housing shelters (1,124)** and **holiday gifts and toys (1,007)**.

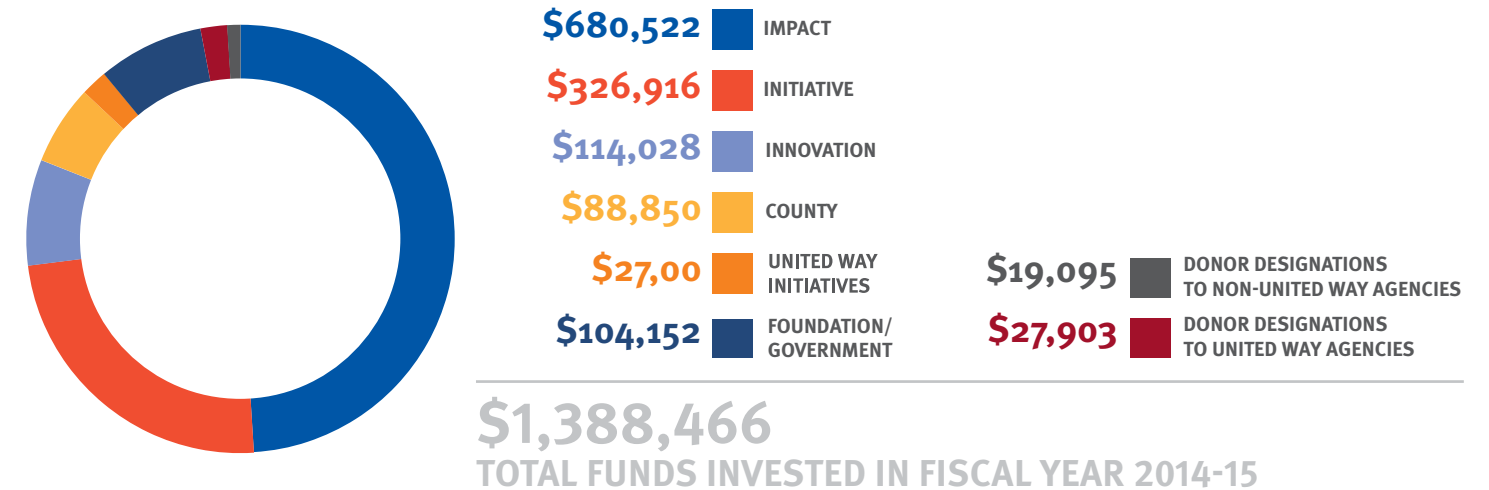
