## LOCAL CONNECTION

Often, at-risk children struggle with negative emotions that affect their lives at home, and as a result, they lash out, misbehave and are reprimanded for disruptive school behavior.

To combat this, United Way partnered with Atlanta Yoga Movement, a non-profit that uses yoga to give students a way to strengthen, heal and regulate their bodies to improve their ability to learn. Students are taught in disciplined classes tailored to meet their unique needs.

Students are learning how to be still, focus their attention and support one another through these daily health-centered practices.

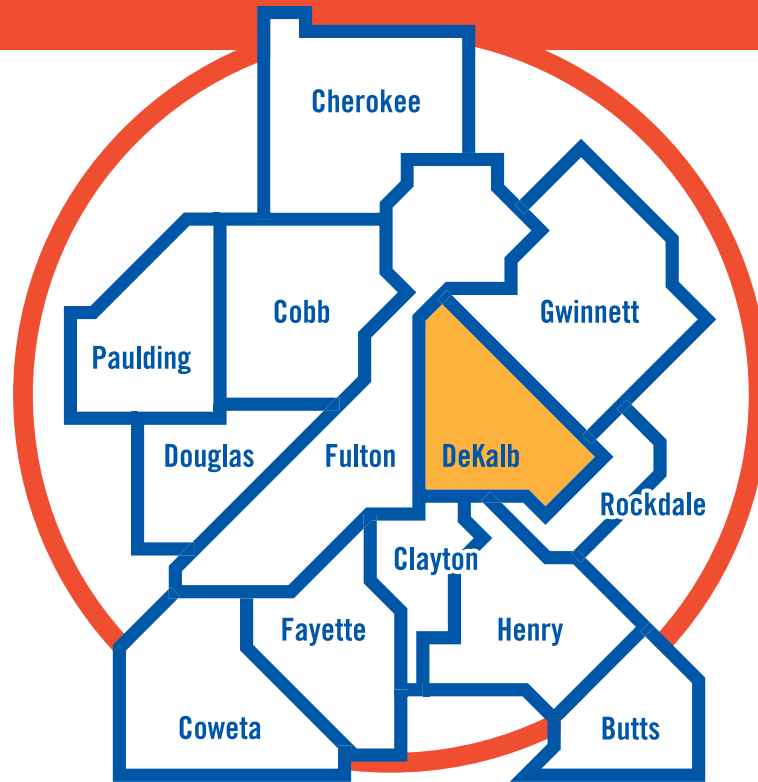

## COMMUNITY HIGHLIGHTS

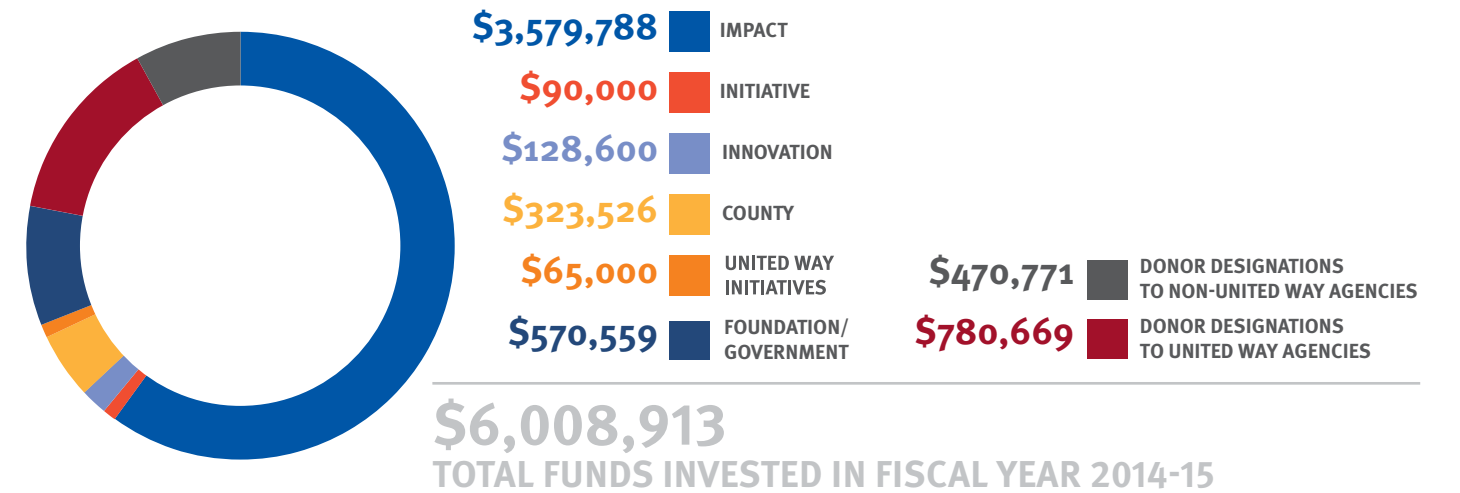
- Last year, United Way and its partners helped 67,256 individuals from DeKalb County.
- 20,225 children showed academic improvement.
- 9,337 youth made the decision to avoid risky behaviors after receiving skills training through targeted programs, including after-school programs.
- 6,685 individuals received emergency financial assistance that enabled them to avoid homelessness and remain in safe and stable housing.
- 7,528 individuals now have a medical home (a routine place to receive preventative health care).
- During the summer of 2015, United Way's Silence the Growl campaign which supports summer feeding programs for children provided 10,052 meals for children in DeKalb County.

### TOTAL FUNDS INVESTED FOR FISCAL YEAR 2014-2015

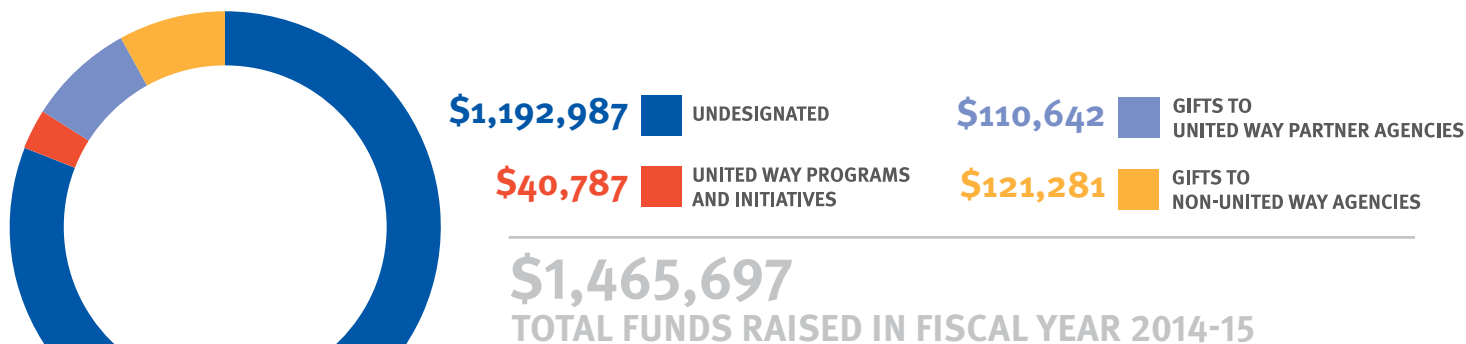


## 2-1-1 DEKALB COUNTY

Information obtained from our 2-1-1 Contact Center is critical to maintaining a connection to the needs of each community United Way serves. 2-1-1 connects people 24/7 to the resources they need to address the everyday challenges of living, as well as those that develop during times of emergencies. Last year 2-1-1 received 33,478 contacts from DeKalb County and the top 5 needs were **electrical service payment assistance (7,713)**, **rent payment assistance (6,176)**, **food pantries (5,743)**, **transitional housing shelters(3,264)** and **community shelters (2,864)**.
