LOCAL CONNECTION



Veterans make up more than 20% of the homeless population in the Greater Atlanta area, which includes Henry County. Unfortunately, many homeless veterans are not getting government benefits, even though they are eligible as a result of their veteran status.

United Way launched VETS CONNECT in Henry County in the spring of 2015. Several events were held with the Department of Veterans Affairs to get the word out to area vets and their families about the benefits available to them. United Way also secured a commitment up to \$20,000 from a local donor to match any funds raised for VETS CONNECT.

As a result, United Way connected nearly 100 veterans and their families to their benefits and provided access to financial support, food and shelter.

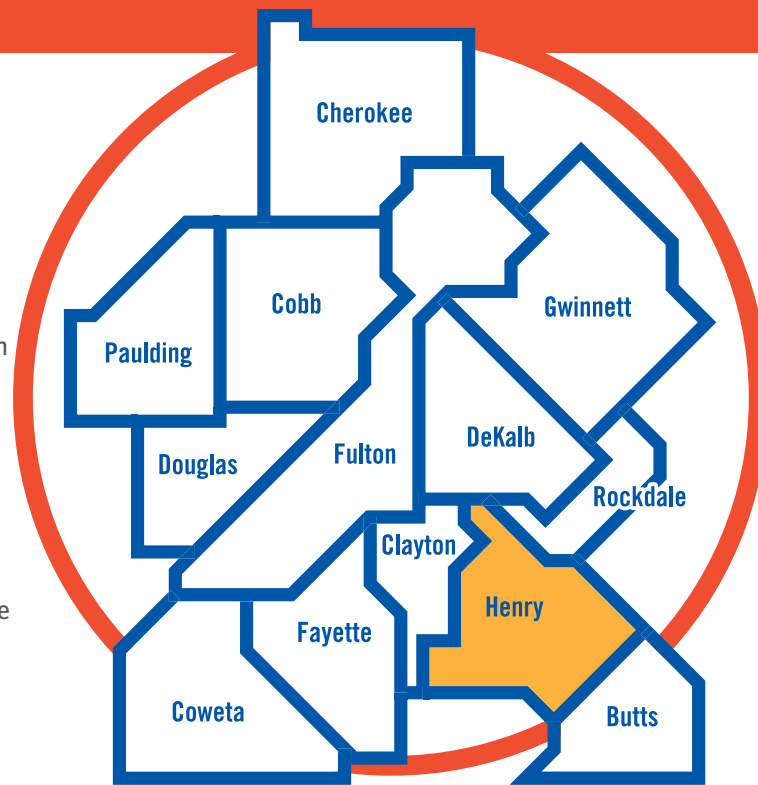

COMMUNITY HIGHLIGHTS

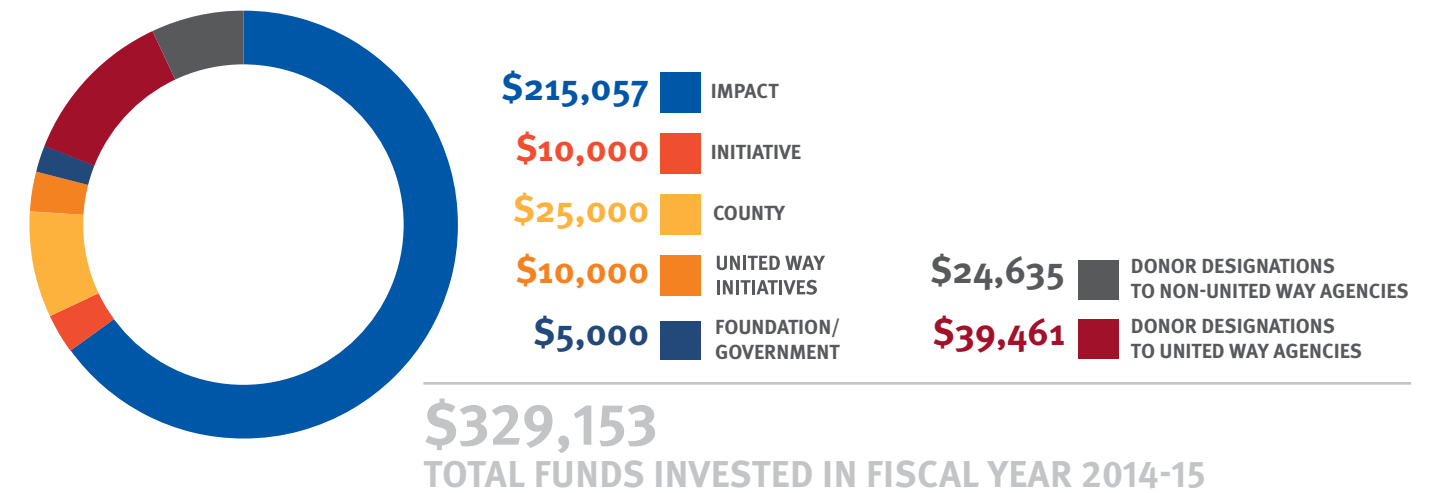
-  Last year, United Way and its partners helped 8,702 individuals from Henry County.
-  United Way's Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) program provided 358 households in Henry County with free tax preparation services.
-  1,426 individuals in Henry County received emergency financial assistance that enabled them to avoid homelessness and remain in safe and stable housing.
-  Because of United Way funding, 1,194 individuals in Henry County now have a medical home (a routine place to receive preventative health care).
-  During the summer of 2015, United Way's Silence the Growl campaign which supports summer feeding programs for children provided 413 meals for children in Henry County.

TOTAL FUNDS INVESTED FOR FISCAL YEAR 2014-2015

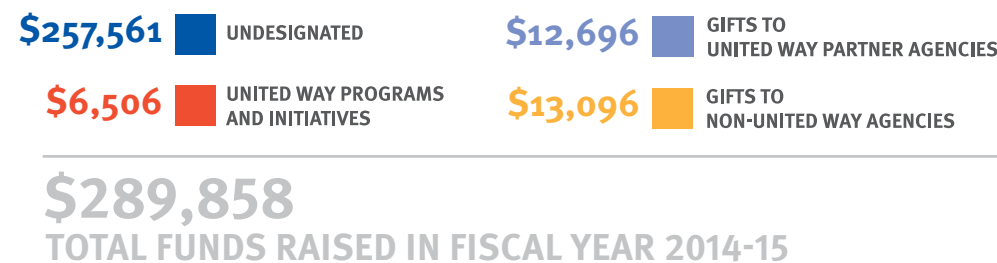
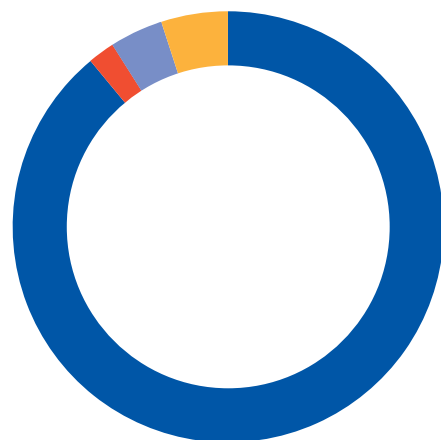


2-1-1 HENRY COUNTY

Information obtained from our 2-1-1 Contact Center is critical to maintaining a connection to the needs of each community United Way serves. 2-1-1 connects people 24/7 to the resources they need to address the everyday challenges of living, as well as those that develop during times of emergencies. Last year 2-1-1 received 3,219 contacts from Henry County and the top 5 needs were **electrical service payment assistance (1,069)**, **rent payment assistance (712)**, **food pantries (710)**, **holiday gifts and toys (400)** and **transitional housing shelters(299)**.
