LOCAL CONNECTION

Many times, family instability can lead to women and children being homeless.

To combat this issue, United Way partners with Phoenix Pass, a program that provides shelter for women and children experiencing temporary homelessness. Women in the program can rebuild their lives through local support services and become self-sufficient through job training.

As a result of the partnership, Phoenix Pass and United Way are helping to increase the number of skilled workers in the workforce. This strategy helps fill the demand for skilled talent in industry sectors that are critical for the growth and development of not only Rockdale County, but also the Greater Atlanta region as a whole.

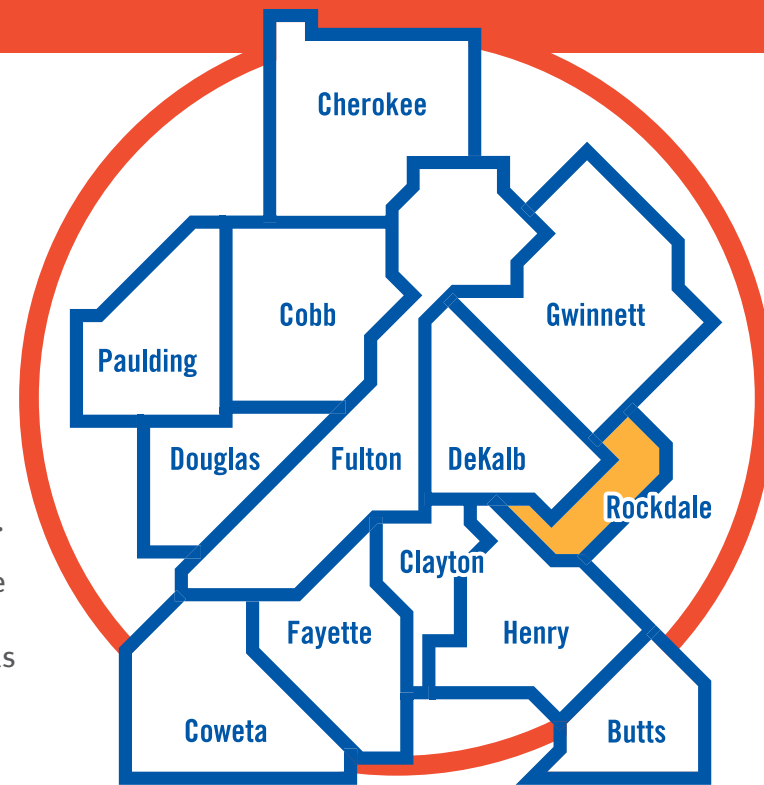

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COMMUNITY HIGHLIGHTS

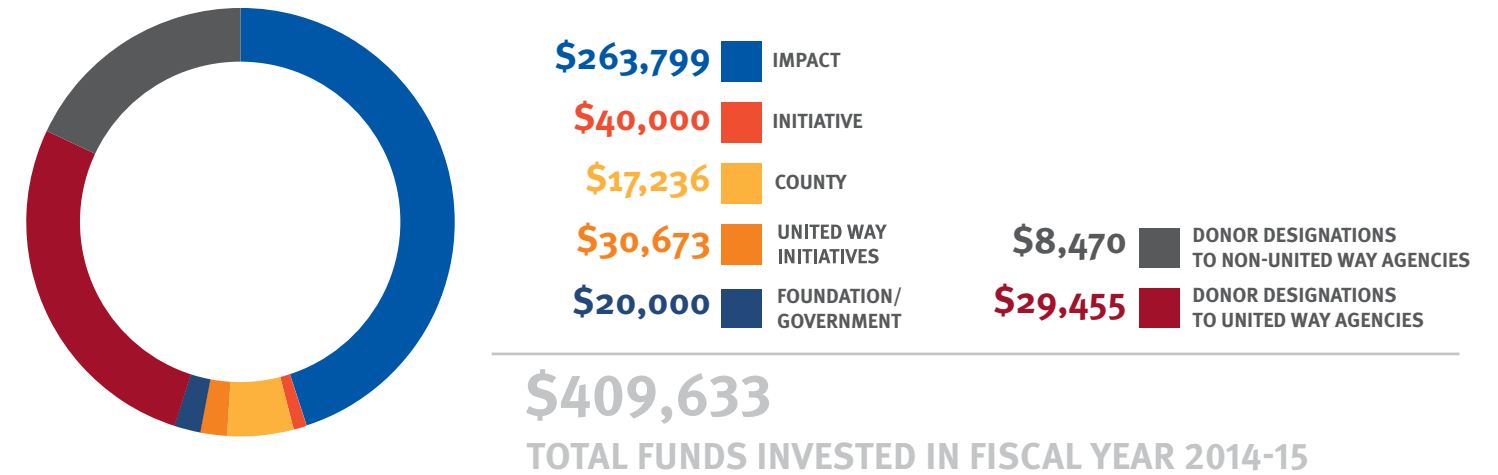
-  Last year, United Way and its partners helped 4,619 individuals from Rockdale County.
-  966 children showed academic improvement.
-  344 individuals received emergency financial assistance that enabled them to avoid homelessness and remain in safe and stable housing.
-  389 individuals now have a medical home (a routine place to receive preventative health care).
-  During the summer of 2015, United Way's Silence the Growl campaign which supports summer feeding programs for children provided 160 meals for children in Rockdale County.

TOTAL FUNDS INVESTED FOR FISCAL YEAR 2014-2015

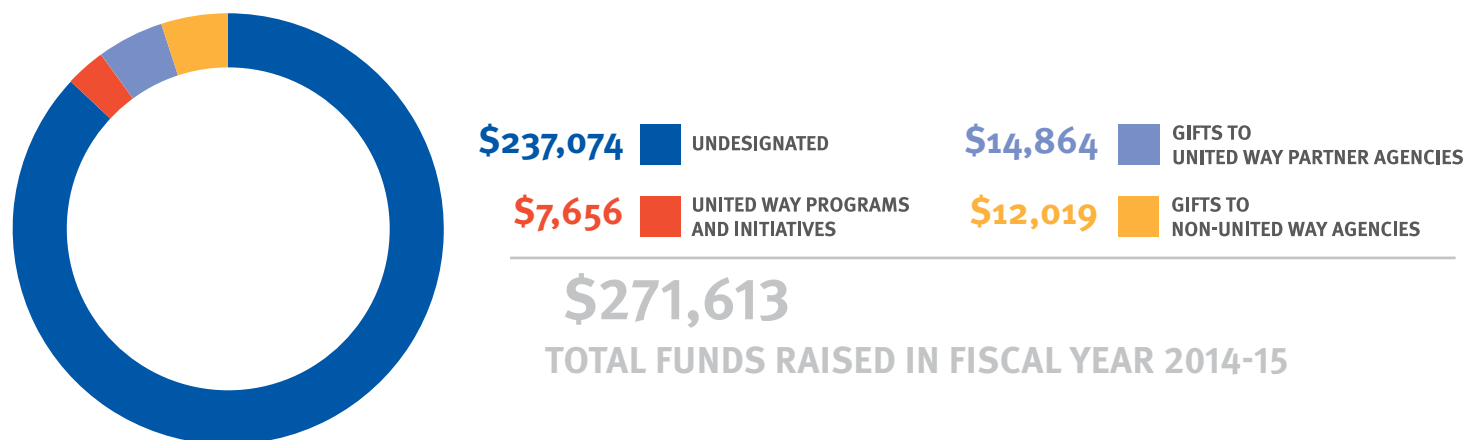


2-1-1 ROCKDALE COUNTY

Information obtained from our 2-1-1 Contact Center is critical to maintaining a connection to the needs of each community United Way serves. 2-1-1 connects people 24/7 to the resources they need to address the everyday challenges of living, as well as those that develop during times of emergencies. Last year 2-1-1 received 2,339 contacts from Rockdale County and the top 5 needs were **rent payment assistance (445)**, **electrical service payment assistance (408)**, **food pantries (340)**, **transitional housing shelters(241)** and **community shelters (225)**.
