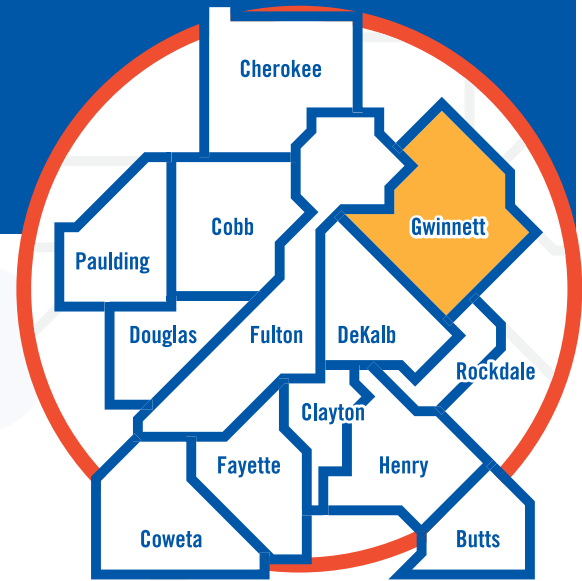

COMMUNITY HIGHLIGHTS

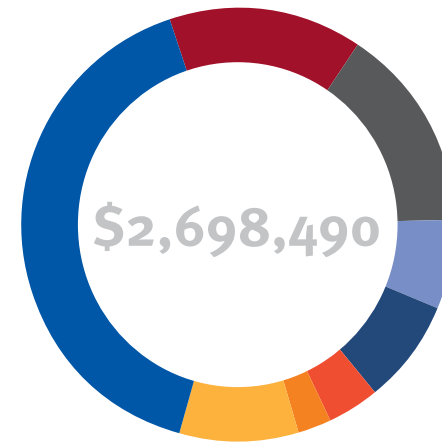
-  **46,832 individuals** were helped by United Way and its Partners in Gwinnett County.
-  **19,024 children** showed academic improvement.
-  **3,845 individuals** remained in stable housing 90 days after receiving financial assistance.
-  **2,577 individuals** received in-home nursing care and improved their health and ultimately avoided hospitalization.
-  **1,230 older adults** who are safe, healthy, happy and able to remain in their homes via Support for Seniors.

Total Funds Invested For Fiscal Year 2015-2016



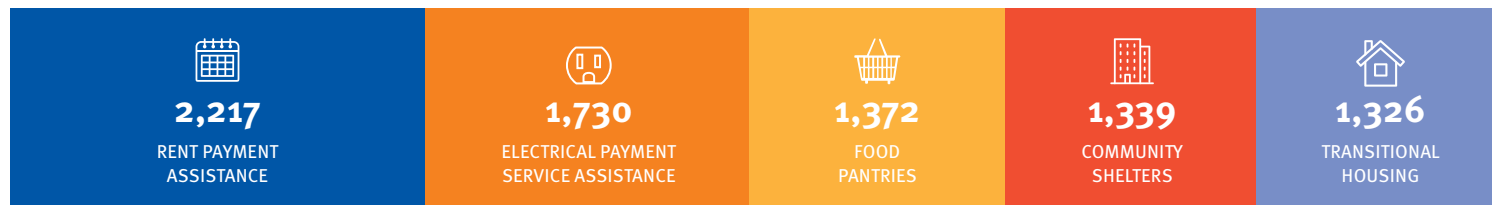

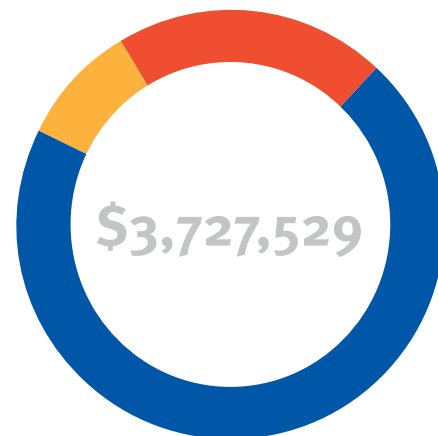


2-1-1 GWINNETT COUNTY

Information obtained from our 2-1-1 Contact Center is critical to maintaining a connection to the needs of each community United Way serves. 2-1-1 connects people 24/7 to the resources they need to address the everyday challenges of living, as well as those that develop during times of emergencies. Last year 2-1-1 received 7,984 contacts from Gwinnett County and the top 5 needs were **rent payment assistance (2,217)**, **electrical service payment assistance (1,730)**, **food pantries (1,372)**, **community shelters (1,339)**, and **transitional housing/shelter (1,326)**.
