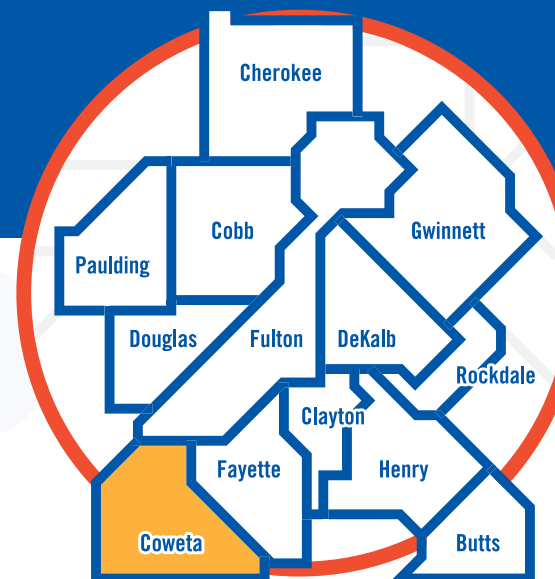

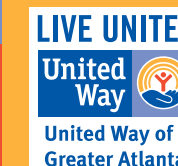

 **1,251 individuals** who are better able to work, support their families and participate in community because of mental health support.

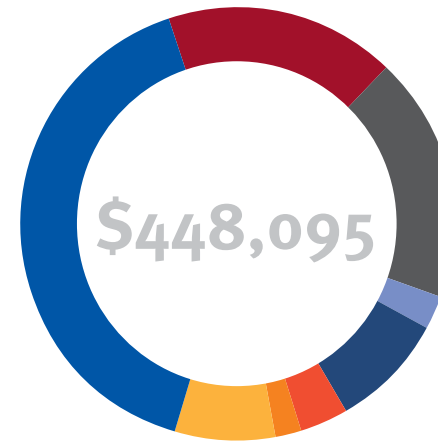
 **458 individuals** remained in stable housing 90 days after receiving assistance.

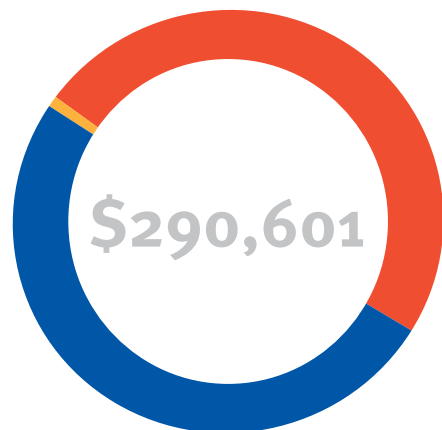


## 2-1-1 COWETA COUNTY

Information obtained from our 2-1-1 Contact Center is critical to maintaining a connection to the needs of each community United Way serves. 2-1-1 connects people 24/7 to the resources they need to address the everyday challenges of living, as well as those that develop during times of emergencies. Last year 2-1-1 received 668 contacts from Coweta County and the top 5 needs were **electrical service payment assistance (225)**, **rent payment assistance (173)**, **food pantries (99)**, **community shelters (86)**, and **transitional housing/shelter (85)**.
