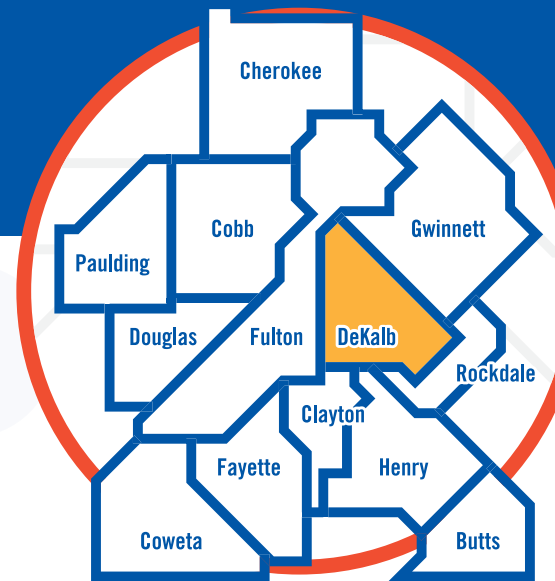

COMMUNITY HIGHLIGHTS

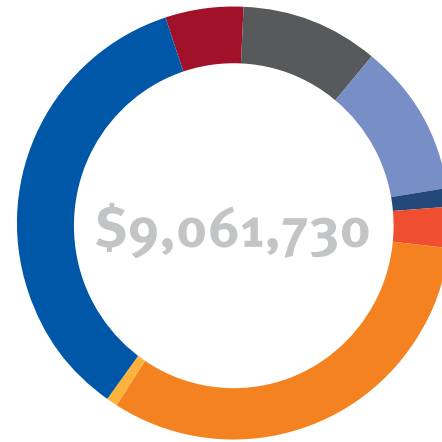
-  **62,273 individuals** were helped by United Way and its Partners in DeKalb County.

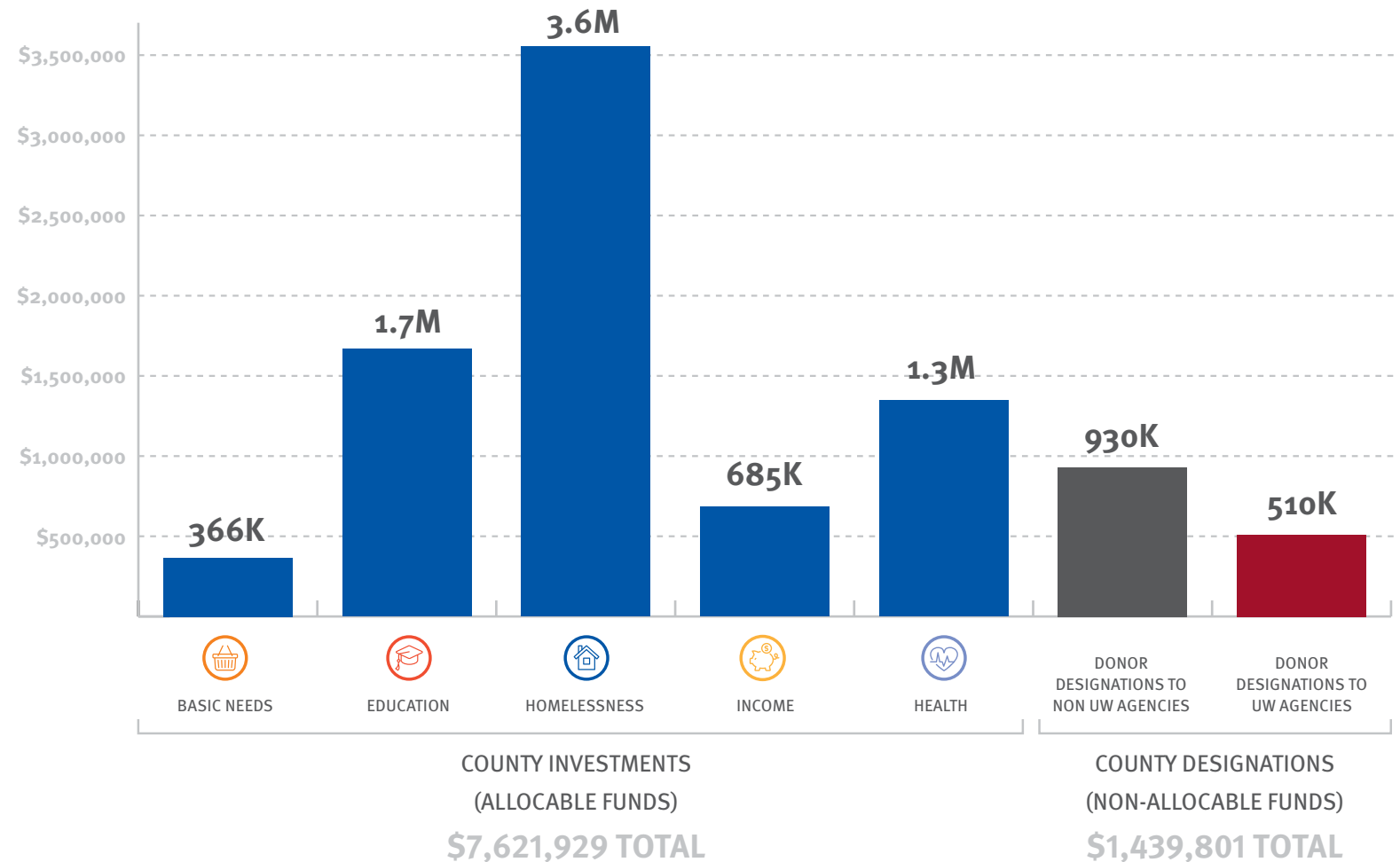


2-1-1 DEKALB COUNTY

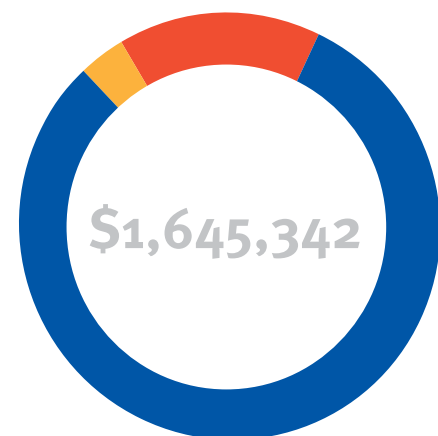
Information obtained from our 2-1-1 Contact Center is critical to maintaining a connection to the needs of each community United Way serves. 2-1-1 connects people 24/7 to the resources they need to address the everyday challenges of living, as well as those that develop during times of emergencies. Last year 2-1-1 received 22,601 contacts from DeKalb County and the top 5 needs were **electrical service payment assistance (6,301)**, **rent payment assistance (5,940)**, **food pantries (4,385)**, **transitional housing/shelter (3,308)**, and **community shelters (2,667)**.
