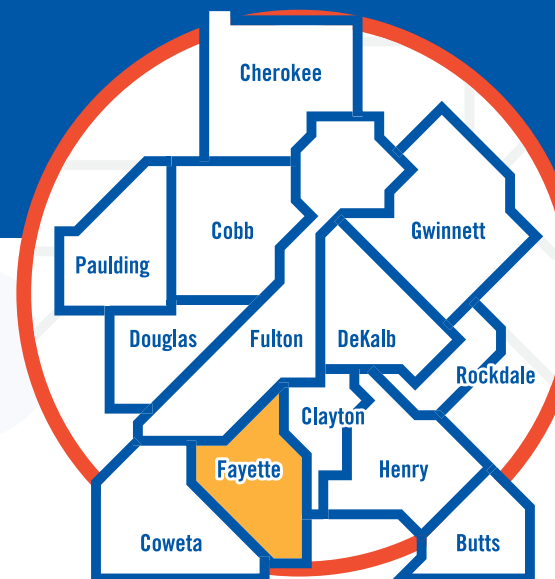

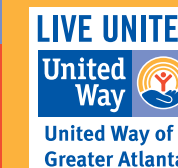

FAYETTE LOCAL CONNECTION

Fayette County has addressed the issue of safety and security for children head on. **Promise Place is an agency in Fayette County that provides safety and resources to victims of domestic violence and their children as they work to resume life on their own.** Support services are provided to the clients to assist them in regaining stability and self-sufficiency. During 2015-2016, 2563 students were served by the Promise Place's child advocacy program and the teen dating violence prevention program in both middle and high schools.

COMMUNITY HIGHLIGHTS

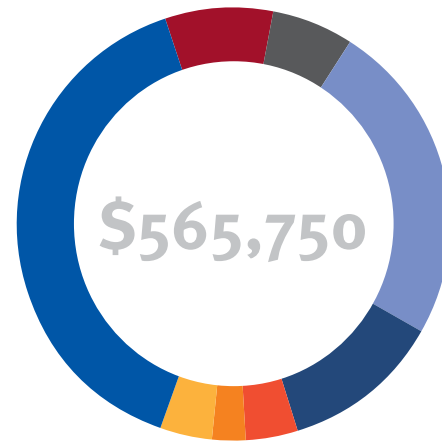
-  Last year United Way and its partners helped **5,886 individuals** in Fayette County.
-  **2,785 children** showed academic improvement.
-  **1,354 individuals** who are better able to work, support their families and participate in community because of mental health support.
-  **191 participants** that have been consistently employed in unsubsidized employment for 90 days, after completing the transitional employment program.

Total Funds Invested For Fiscal Year 2015-2016



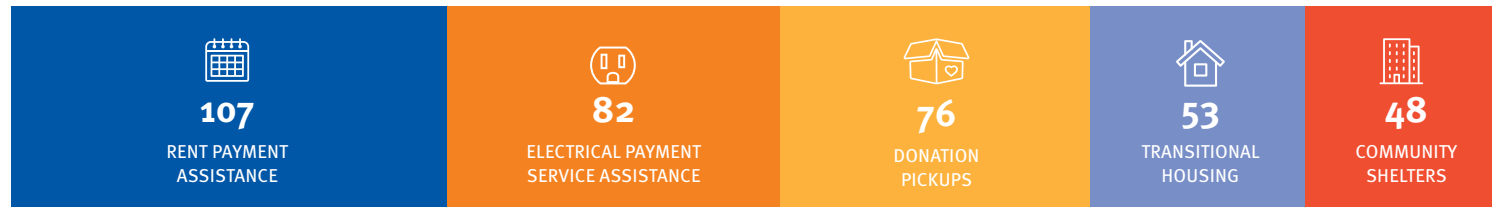

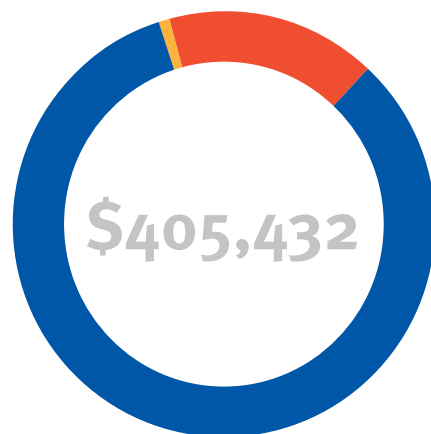


2-1-1 FAYETTE COUNTY

Information obtained from our 2-1-1 Contact Center is critical to maintaining a connection to the needs of each community United Way serves. 2-1-1 connects people 24/7 to the resources they need to address the everyday challenges of living, as well as those that develop during times of emergencies. Last year 2-1-1 received 366 contacts from Fayette County and the top 5 needs were **rent payment assistance (107)**, **electrical service payment assistance (82)**, **donation pickups (76)**, **transitional housing/shelter (53)**, and **community shelters (48)**.
